# Notes From Parish Nurse Nancy Eberhardt, RN

Dear Friends of Zion UMC,

May you and your loved ones experience a joyfilled and healthy New Year and Epiphany season! As we begin this New Year, I would like to visit with you about the **Season of Epiphany and living a Spirit filled and wholistically healthy life.** The word Epiphany means "to make known" and during this season we celebrate the full measure of God's glory in the birth of Jesus.

#### Epiphany: Living in and Reflecting the Light

One of the Old Testament Lessons for the Epiphany season is taken from Isaiah 42:1-7. These words describe living a spirit filled life. God has called and enabled each one of us to be His healing lights in our dark world as we "....open the eyes that are blind, to free the captives from prison and to release from the dungeon those who sit in darkness". First, we need to make sure we are in a right relationship with God. Eyes can be blinded both physically and spiritually and this causes darkness to overshadow the light. Second, our great God can use us to help others know the light of His love as we care for them. We are called to free the captives and release those who sit in darkness. People can be imprisoned by sin, death and the devil. Third, we can speak God's word of healing grace to others and invite them into a relationship with ourselves and our faith community. The darkness of our lives can only be overcome when we see the Baby of Bethlehem in the face of every precious person He has created. (Matthew 25:35-40).
